## Give to Lincoln Day 2020

Give to Lincoln Day is an event that encourages people to contribute to Lincoln and Lancaster County nonprofit organizations. Give to Lincoln Day is coordinated by Lincoln Community Foundation, in partnership with local nonprofit organizations. Every donation made through Give to Lincoln Day makes a bigger impact, because nonprofits also get a proportional share of a \$500,000 matching fund.

### Making a donation:

Online donations can be made with a credit/debit card at [www.givetolincoln.com](http://www.givetolincoln.com) from May 1 starting at 12:00am, through May 28 at 11:59pm.

### Is there a minimum / maximum donation?

The minimum donation on [www.givetolincoln.com](http://www.givetolincoln.com) is \$10.

There is no maximum donation limit. Household gifts exceeding \$10,000 per nonprofit will be eligible for match fund dollars up to \$10,000, and any amount in excess of \$10,000 will not be eligible for the match fund.

### What does all of this mean for the Elks?

The Elks scholarship fund is eligible to receive funds through the Give to Lincoln Day event. This is the sixth year we have participated in this event, and have increased our base scholarship fund each year. If you have ever wanted to give to the scholarship fund, now is the time. All contributions are tax deductible and will be increased by the matching funds through the Lincoln Community Foundation. The Lincoln Elks Lodge makes a huge impact on the community with the scholarships that we give. We should be very proud that we can have an impact on so many young adults in the area. Any contributions that you can make to the scholarship fund will help keep this program strong, and will ensure the viability of this program well into the future. ## Scholarship Updates

Scholarship winners have been determined and have been posted to our website. Congratulatory letters will be going out soon! We had many very good applicants, and the decisions were quite difficult, but we trust that those who were fortunate enough to be recipients will put the money to good use.

As we had to cancel our Youth Day Recognition Ceremony due to the COVID19 crisis response, our Junior nominees will receive their certificates via mail.

We also had great news from the Elks National Foundation's Most Valuable Student Selection Committee! One of Lodge 80's nominated students, Flopateer Habib, a student at Waverly High School, was selected as one of the 20 national finalists, and as such will receive at minimum a \$20,000 ENF scholarship! He is also in the running for the \$30,000, \$40,000, and \$50,000 scholarships! We recognized Flopateer at our Youth Night last year. Hopefully we will receive even more good news about this outstanding young man!

In other scholarship news, we have been notified by the Nebraska State Elks Association that three Lodge 80 applicants were awarded scholarships.: Flopateer Habib and Kevin Coffey won MVS awards, and Ethan Lavelle (Dave and Sandy Reiber's grandson) won a PER scholarship. Congratulations to these winners!

## Gratitude Grant News

The Gratitude Grant was the only grant that was available on April 1 this year, and the Elks National Foundation informed us that they were encouraging lodges to apply for that grant to give to a local organization that already had the framework in place to give aid to the community during COVID19.

It was proposed that we apply for this grant to help fund a project with which we are well acquainted., WE CAN DO THIS at the F Street Community Center, and passed by the membership at our April 1, 2020 meeting. This center serves one of the lowest income area in the city. WE CAN DO THIS is working to provide a bag of food each week to every student (about 70 in all) who would normally have had breakfast and lunch at school, except the schools are closed due to COVID19.

Our grant application was accepted, the \$2,500 check received from ENF, and it is on its way to the founder of WE CAN DO THIS, Susie Brown. Susie was recognized as Lodge 80's Citizen of the Year in 2017 for the work she did in founding this grassroots organization, which began in 2015 when her daughter brought to her attention that kids at the F Street Community Center where she worked were going hungry all weekend.

We know Susie will put this grant money to good use feeding children who might not otherwise eat. All Lodge 80 members can rest secure that the Lodge is doing its part to help support our community in this time of crisis.

Given our history of support for our military and veterans, consider doing something for Armed Forces Day and Memorial Day. They are good occasions to pay respect to those who served and to reach into our communities to develop relationships.

I hope the new Financial Reporting System has been implemented in your Lodge. Grand Lodge wants Elkdom to prosper in our communities. The system has been developed and approved by the membership to help identify Lodges having problems and provide opportunities to bring in needed resources.

Looking ahead, in June you might want to start thinking about Father's Day, Flag Day (a mandatory service), and the submission of your audit report. Planning for these events well in advance can make them more enjoyable and better supported by the Members.

It's only fitting that it's snowing today. I used to think that once you got into April, that white stuff was not going to happen. As it turns out, I am very wrong. In the last 25 years, in fact, it has snowed at least 8 times after April 1. I suppose that if you were a statistician you could figure out the probability of when it was going to snow in April.

I am told that even in the most stressful moments that each of us (could) face, a fresh snowfall maintains an almost supernatural power to calm us down -- mind, body and soul. This "snow" could not have happened at a more appropriate time.

The Temple, TX Lodge presented a \$1,000.00 contribution to Feed My Sheep foundation to purchase a new freezer. The Santa Maria, CA fed the local night Nursing staff meatloaf dinners. Finally, our lodge (Lincoln #80) presented the \$2,500.00 Gratitude Grant to the F Street Community Center help continually feed 75 low income children. F Street, in case you did not realize it, is a nonprofit community center dedicated to fighting hunger. Did you realize that one in five children in Nebraska is at risk for hunger? I am glad we can help! As we are in the midst of turmoil between political opponents vying for headlines, it seems that the news hasn't changed. Your surroundings haven't changed. TV hasn't changed. But there is something rising in the East. That something is Hope. Alfred Lord Tennyson once wrote "Hope smiles from the threshold of the year to come, whispering 'it will be happier'..."

If you haven't joined our Facebook page or visited our Webpage please do. In the next few weeks, we will be letting you know how we might (possibly) slowly reopen our lodge. How you can attend our meetings (without physically being there) or how you can have a drive-in dinner and more exciting things to come.

I am not sure which character in Winnie-the-Pooh said this that the "River(s) know this: there is no hurry. We shall get there some day." Hang in there WE will be seeing you in our Lodge.

An Addendum: I would like to thank Jerry for the time that he spent working for all of us in our lodge. He was a big part of our Lodge for many, many years. When you see him please tell him Thanks!

Of course, you can also sign up for our automatic payment program, where your dues are prorated over the year and automatically deducted from your checking account monthly to the tune of currently, about \$8 a month – and your membership card just appears every April with nary a thought on your part (I have done this since I became an Elk)! As a reminder, you are not considered to be an Elk in good standing while your dues remain unpaid.

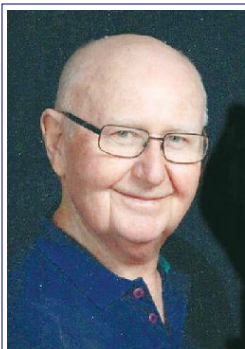

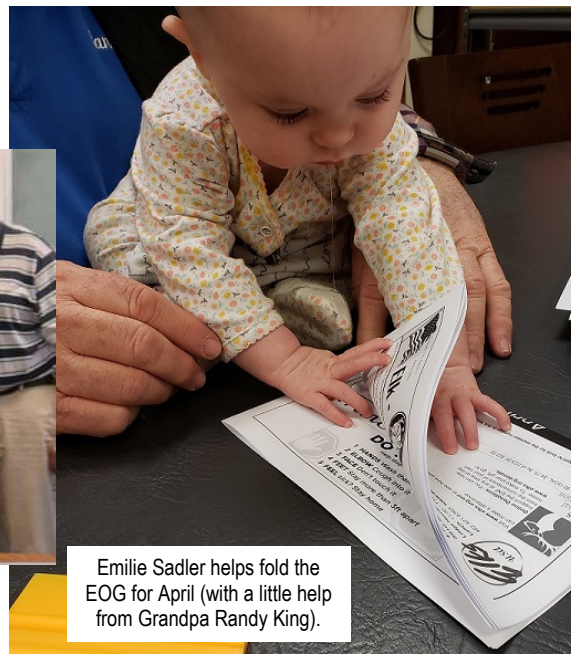


