## Secretary's Corner

Meteorological Fall begins September 1 - nights are growing cooler and days are growing shorter, and leaves will soon begin to fall. The autumnal equinox will occur on September 22, and we begin our transition to longer nights and shorter days. COVID 19 is still an issue. A Presidential election looms large.

Please remember – your membership dues are actually payable on or before April 1 of each year. If you pay them after April 1, you are delinquent and are not considered an Elk in good standing until they are paid. We have already begun to limit pub access to delinquent members, and there are other consequences which I have enumerated in previous months. This is not intended to be punitive, but without the income from our members' dues and the income from our activities such as dinners and raffles, we cannot pay our bills. As you can see, your faithful participation in paying your dues and attending and supporting our activities is the lifeblood of the Lodge.

Speaking of dues, Grand Lodge has engaged a company to streamline and cut the expenses of the billing of dues. Lodges will be charged \$0.32 per member, which is a considerable savings to the lodge over the current practice. We have also expanded the options for charitable contributions to the Scholarship Fund as well as contributions to Lodge 80's community projects, as well as implementing a voluntary "Round UP for 80" option to enable you to help further to keep the Lodge in good health. More on this in later Elk-O-Grams.

We are also in the process of establishing a voicemail box on our lodge phone number, so feel free to call and leave a message if no one is available to answer. In the meantime, be well! Hope to see you at the lodge soon!



It has been a while since we last communicated. A lot of issues have transpired in your lodge in the meantime. For the past several years we have had to pay property taxes on the lounge. The county increased our land valuation, which had not been done for several years. We had two options one simply pay the higher taxes or try to get a tax-exemption. Based on Nebraska Law, we successfully applied for and we were granted a new tax exemption.

President John Kennedy once stated that "Victory has a hundred fathers and defeat is an orphan." Our Orphan is in our operational hours. In order to save we had to cut operational hours in our lounge. The restaurant can be opened but when we serve adult beverages had to be limited to 20 hours or less. This decision was made in a collective meeting with The Trustees and the House committees. These appointed and elected men and women are working for the good of our lodge and most of the time their work goes unnoticed

When you read the news, it is hard to separate opinion from truth, especially when it comes to the pandemic. Who to believe, who not to believe? Some people say it's made up, while others are still locked in their homes. My objective here is not to draw conclusions about the virus but to trust.

On July 20<sup>th</sup> the state of Nebraska and the City of Lincoln issued a new DHM that runs until August 31. The DHM states Indoor gatherings will be limited 50 people or 50% of rated occupancy Restaurants and bars can allow up to 100% occupancy but they are required to continue to space individuals, or groups of 8 or less, 6 feet apart (this may affect the ability to attain 100% occupancy). Patrons/parties must be seated at individual tables and be a minimum of 6 feet apart and remain at their table. Employees such as wait staff and cashiers shall wear face coverings. Special requirements for disinfection must be followed. Seems simple right? Well its not depending on your point of view. It can be interpreted differently, (honestly officer I, was only going 70! Stories, discussions, thoughts can be mistakenly told and then passed on as gospel. Did you hear that Mister Rogers wore sweaters to cover up tattoos on his arms? Did you hear that Elvis Presley is still alive?

Our lodge is straining. But we need to be steadfast in how we do things. Yes, its hard to operate when you don't do dinners and raffles. Or when the Lodge room is not rented or when we are open no one comes in.

We are at a time when we all have to stick together. Ask questions, and yes, participate.
