Medal of Valor honors

our fallen heros"

The Medal of Valor program commenced in February 2007 and was promoted by your Elks National Veterans Service Commission. The purpose of the program is to give our Lodges the opportunity to honor individuals who served in our military and made the supreme sacrifice defending our country and our freedoms. The Medal of Valor is to be presented to the deserving family of the fallen hero who gave up his or her life in the ongoing Iraqi and Afghanistan conflicts.

**April 2011** 

The medals are made in the United States and come with a presentation case. The front of the medal is engraved with "Operation Enduring Freedom" on top and "Operation Iraqi Freedom" on the bottom. The back is suitable for engraving the name of the deceased Veteran and also states, "Presented by the Grand Lodge of the B.P.O. Elks to the family of (Name) in recognition of their supreme sacrifice." The cost is \$8 per medal, which includes shipping.

If you know of a family that has lost a loved one in Iraq or Afghanistan, it would be a wonderful gesture to honor that person by presenting a Medal of Valor to the family. It could be presented at a Lodge function or other appropriate venue.

To order the Medal of Valor, contact the Elks National Veterans Service Commission at 2750 N. Lakeview Ave., Chicago, IL 60614-1889 or by e-mail to vets@elks.org and the medal will be promptly shipped to you.



## Lincoln Boy Crowned the Hoop Shoot Regional Champ

Lincoln, Nebraska, Resident Holton Harman Crowned Elks "Hoop Shoot" Regional Champ Holton, Now Among 72 Free -Throw Shooters Vying for National Title.

Lincoln, Nebraska —Having already tasted glory in local, district, and state competitions, Holton Harman captured another first-place finish on Saturday, March 12, 2011 when he wowed the crowds at the Elks "Hoop Shoot" West Central Regional Championship. Holton, the 9-year-old son of Hunter and Sheila Harman, demonstrated accuracy from the penalty line well beyond his years and brought honors to his hometown of Lincoln, Nebraska.

Representing Fairbury, Nebraska Elks Lodge 1203, Holton, a student at St. Peters Elementary sank 25 out of 25 free throws in the 8- to 9-year-old Boys division, making him a true standout in the field of more than 3 million boys and girls, ages 8-13, who have participated in the contest since last fall. Now, Holton will travel with his parents, courtesy of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, to Springfield, Massachusetts—the birthplace of basketball —to be among the 72 top youngsters vying for the chance to claim one of six national trophies awarded at the Elks "Hoop Shoot" National Free Throw Contest, April 28 to May1, 2011. A great showing in the national championship will not only earn Holton a place in Elks "Hoop Shoot" history, but also land his name on a plaque in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Now in its 39th year, the Elks "Hoop Shoot" Free Throw Contest has seen more than 110 million participants since its inception, making it the largest coeducational youth sports program in the nation. Funded entirely by the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, the Elks "Hoop Shoot" Free Throw Contest has served as a testing ground for sports legends, Olympic medalists and numerous professional athletes.
