Youth Committee:



Happy Birthday Elks! Our Birthday is Wednesday, February 16. 1868. If my calculations are correct that makes us 154 years young.

Since our founding, a lot of events had taken place. In 1868, the Elks adopted our current name. We had changed from the Jolly Corks organization to the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE). As Exalted Ruler Walter Andrews wrote in his message in February 1930 "I earnestly urge every Brother Elk to pause and give loyal consideration to this day, and to pledge himself anew to the service of this great American brotherhood."

1868 started off rather uneventfully. However, when President Andrew Johnson dismissed Secretary of War Edwin M. Stanton, the House of Representatives voted 126 to 47 in favor of a resolution to impeach him. Florida, Alabama, Louisiana, Georgia, North Carolina, and South Carolina were all readmitted to the union. and Memorial Day was finally observed in the United States. Our neighbor to the west, Wyoming, was being organized as a territory. Incidentally we Nebraskans were just about a year old. How the picture of Nebraska and the United States has changed!

February is a month that our lodge will be busy electing new leadership. As a reminder, our Legacy Scholarships deadline is also this month. Remember, this scholarship is for any Elks Member's children and grandchildren.

The Trustees will be formulating our budget and presenting it to us soon. We will have a few weeks to look it over and vote on it. I urge you to attend a meeting, listen to the presentation, and vote. It's a great time to get reconnected. We, no matter who we are, are tied together because of common beliefs and aspirations. We lost members because they passed or they have decided that the Elks are not for them. For the latter, I am truly sorry (We cannot help if we do not know!).

I do urge every member to attend a meeting, get involved, express yourself, be heard. Help us grow not only in membership but in presence in our community. I am very proud of my association with our membership and the Officers and Trustees whom I have had the pleasure to be a part of. As T. Keith Miles states "Do not look at February as only having a few weeks left to serve, but as the opportunity to finish the year strong." I say amen to that. We are not impeaching anyone. We are 50 States plus territories strong. We are able to travel to our neighboring states. We live in a country that has an abundance of sights and majestic beauty that is available to all of us for FREE.


