Parliamentary Procedure...

"Parliamentary Procedure" provides the process for proposing, amending, approving, and defeating legislative motions. All Elk lodges across the US follow Roberts Rules of Order, which is a set

of rules for facilitating discussions and group decision-making. Roberts Rules of Order can be found online or in a library.

Some simple reminders that we should all follow: Our ER (Exalted Ruler) is the de-facto President and Chairperson of our body and will lead all discussions. If we would like to address something or bring up a motion, we need to arise from our seat and be recognized by the Exalted Ruler before speaking. Should the Exalted Ruler not recognize you, you may not verbally interrupt the Exalted Ruler.

Your choice is to remain standing or sit down. If another person is recognized by the Exalted Ruler and given the floor, that person has the right to express themselves without any interruption or direct cross examination from the members. If the members would like to address the floor, again, they must arise from their seat and be recognized before speaking. When speaking or offering an opinion, one must remember not to attack the member but offer their views on the subject matter, which can be different. If one desires to ask a question of the member speaking, he should rise, and without waiting to be recognized, say, "Exalted Ruler, I should like to ask the speaker a question." The chair then asks the speaker if he is willing to be interrupted, or the speaker may at once consent or decline, addressing, however, the chair, through whom the conversation must be carried on, as members cannot directly address one another in a deliberative assembly. You may INTERRUPT a speaker for these reasons only: but you need to stand and ask for additional information. If you can't hear – question of privilege Or if you see a breach of the rules – point of order.

Parliamentary Procedure is the best way to get things done at our meetings, but it will only work if it is used properly. If you would like a copy of the pamphlet describing Parliamentary Procedure just let us know and we will get you a copy. - Thanks, Harry




