Give to Lincoln Day...

Event Overview:

Give to Lincoln Day is an event that encourages people to contribute to Lincoln and Lancaster County nonprofit organizations. Give to Lincoln Day is coordinated by Lincoln Community Foundation, in partnership with local nonprofit organizations. Every donation made through Give to Lincoln Day makes a bigger impact, because nonprofits also get a proportional share of a \$500,000 matching fund.

Making a donation:

Online donations (the preferred method) can be made with a credit/debit card at www.givetolincoln.com from May 1 starting at 12:00am, through May 24 at 11:59pm. Offline donations (checks) will follow a special process this year. Checks must be written to "Lincoln Community Foundation" with the nonprofit name specified in the memo line, and mailed to the address below (postmarked by May 17): Lincoln Community Foundation 215 Centennial Mall South, Suite 100, Lincoln NE 68508

Is there a minimum/maximum donation?

The minimum donation on www.givetolincoln.com is \$10. There is no maximum donation limit. Household gifts exceeding \$10,000 per non-profit will be eligible for match fund dollars up to \$10,000, and any amount in excess of \$10,000 will not be eligible for the match fund.

What does all of this mean for the Elks?

The Elks Scholarship Fund is eligible to receive funds through the Give to Lincoln Day event. This is the sixth year we have participated in this event, and have increased our base scholarship fund each year. If you have ever wanted to give to the scholarship fund, now is the time! All contributions are tax deductible and will be increased by the matching funds through the Lincoln Community Foundation. The Lincoln Elks Lodge makes a huge impact on the community with the scholarships that we give. We should be very proud that we can have an impact on so many young adults in the area. 
