Exalted Ruler Larry Schwindt Lincoln Lodge No. 80 2023-2024 A New Adventure

Our Lodge is about to embark on a new adventure. As many of you are aware, since COVID, we have not been hosting the annual Children's Christmas Party. A vote was taken at a Lodge meeting last year to discontinue this 117-year tradition. During the COVID years and through last year, the Lodge voted to distribute the funds normally used for the Christmas Party to some worthy organizations throughout our community.

This year we are starting a new Christmas Giving Program which will focus on helping those less fortunate in our area, as well as encouraging our members to get involved.

We have been in discussions with three organizations in Lincoln that are actively involved with helping people in lower income areas of the city. These organizations will be providing us with information about families that we can "adopt". The organizations will contact these families and collect information about what the children in these families need. Their need may be shoes, coats, clothing, food items, or any number of items.

What we are asking for, is members who are willing to help shop for these items once we compile a list from these three organizations. **The Lodge will provide the funds for shopping.** Since this is a new project, we are still in the planning stages and are not sure how the shopping excursion will be organized. More to follow about that at a later date. At our last dinner, a list for volunteer shoppers was started, and we already have some people willing to help, but we are looking for many more. We are hoping to have at least as many people help with this project, as have helped in the past with the Children's Christmas Party (usually around 40-50). We will be using the three organizations as distribution points for the items, and would also love to have people help with the distribution process.

You may be wondering about the goodie bags that we've made and distributed the last few years. This was discussed, but if we did the goodie bags in conjunction with the Christmas Giving Program, the cost of doing the goodie bags would mean we would have to eliminate one of the three areas of the city, and decided it was more important to give essential items as opposed to candy and snacks.

I feel that this new project will fill a void for those members who joined our great organization and wanted to have a hands-on part in helping our community. This project will allow our members to have a personal impact on the youth in some of the areas most in need in our community.

With your help, we are hoping this new project will be a huge success and that we will be able to apply for a grant next year to expand it even further. We need a signature project for Lincoln Elks Lodge #80 to let the city of Lincoln know that we are still here and that we still care about the people in our community.

We have some big changes coming to our Lodge scholarships this year! First and foremost, the due date for all applications, including Legacy applications, is Saturday, December 30, 2023. NO LATE APPLICATIONS

WILL BE ACCEPTED, so be sure to mail them early, or drop off at the lodge by 7:00 p.m. on that day.

We discontinued some scholarships, combined a few scholarships, and increased the amount of money for Legacy scholarships, as well as changing the manner in which they are awarded. All these changes culminated in our being able to raise every scholarship to the \$1,000 level or better! As tuition has increased to around \$250 per credit hour at UNL, we are pleased that our scholarships will now better assist the recipients.



Also please note, the Elks National Foundation (ENF) Most Valuable Student Scholarship applications are due November 14. These applications are entirely online. Every high school senior in the country is eligible to apply. If you know a senior, please guide them to https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/MVS.cfm.

ENF Legacy Scholarships are also available to members' children only. These are \$4,000 scholarships that are awarded to high school seniors. The deadline to apply is February 5, 2024. If you have children or grandchildren who are high school seniors this year, please guide them to https://www.elks.org/scholarships/Legacy.cfm.

The Nebraska Elks Association also offers scholarships to high school seniors, including general scholarships, vocational scholarships, and even a
