Our second year for our Christmas Giving Project was even better than the first! Once again, our members, their spouses and friends responded in force to help the children in our community. I was overwhelmed by the number of people who volunteered to help with this project.

We compiled lists of families and items the kids wanted and/or needed for Christmas, then generated shopping lists for each family and scheduled a shopping night. On the shopping night we had 14 Elks and 15 non-Elks come to help. We passed out shopping lists and turned everyone loose. After three and a half hours of shopping, everything was loaded into vehicles and dropped off at my house. All of the items were then sorted into bags for each individual child and later taken to the Lodge to be wrapped. On wrapping night, we had 18 Elks and 26 non-Elks come to help, and also donated boxes, tape, wrapping paper, gift bags, tissue paper, bike bags, bows, and ribbon. In a little over three hours, gifts for 163 kids were wrapped, bagged, and ready for delivery. 15986

All totaled we were able to make Christmas brighter for 82 families (up from 59 families last year) with a combined 250 children, (up from 194 children last year). You may notice a difference between the number of children that we helped and the number of wrapped gifts for the kids. The difference is because one of the agencies we donated to, did not want their gifts wrapped.

This worthwhile and fulfilling endeavor was made possible by the time and energy supplied by the people who volunteered their time and talents to make this program such a success. All totaled there were 291 Elk Hours, 544 Elk miles, 235 non-Elk hours, 654 non-Elk miles.

I especially wish to thank the members Corvette Club who helped us with this project. They heard about our endeavor and wanted to volunteer by buying some of the gifts on our shopping lists, as well as helping wrap the gifts. Their generosity in purchasing some of the gifts allowed us to stretch our funds a little bit farther and provide more gifts for the kids, and it definitely shortened the time needed to wrap the gifts.

The generosity and willingness to help with this project reaffirms why the Elks are the foremost charitable organization in the country! ELKS CARE – ELKS SHARE!

Thank you from the bottom of my heart to all of you who took time out of your busy lives to help brighten the lives of so many families and children!


