Because we receive a reduced postage rate, the Post Office will not forward your newsletter, and it automatically generates a notice of mail stoppage or no forwarding address to us at a cost of nearly a



dollar each. PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE – if you are leaving for an extended period of time, please let us know before you go. We can send to an alternate address; we can stop sending until you notify us of your return; or we can put you on our email list for a bright, shiny color PDF of the Elk-O-Gram (we can even send this along with the mailed version if you'd like!). Every dollar saved is a good thing!

Remember – April 1 is the beginning of our Lodge year. Avoid becoming a delinquent member by paying your dues BEFORE MAY 1! A big thank-you to those who have already remitted!

If you wish to pay your dues by credit or debit card, please use the secure website provided by Grand Lodge. This website is compliant with new federal regulations that require a higher level of security when transmitting credit card information. A bright yellow button now appears on our home page at elks80.org - it's on the left-screen menu and is labeled PAY DUES ON-LINE and it will take you to the dues processing page. You'll need to enter your membership number with a leading zero - then the rest is a snap!




