ELKS SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Elks National Foundation (ENF) Most Valuable Student (MVS) Scholarship Applications are **due online by 11:59 p.m. on November 12, 2025**. These scholarships are open to any high school senior planning to pursue at minimum a 4-year degree in a U.S. college or university, and are completed online. They range from \$1,000 to \$7,500 per year over four years. The MVS are more than just a scholarship – more information at <https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/MVS.cfm>

ENF Legacy Scholarship Applications are due online by February 2, 2026, 11:59 a.m. They are available to any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2023, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2023. The Elk must also be a paid-up member for two contiguous years through March 31, 2026. Great-grandchildren are not eligible. These scholarships total \$4,000 over four years. ENF Emergency Educational Grants are available to the children of deceased or totally disabled Elks. For more information, see the webpage <https://www.elks.org/scholars/scholarships/Legacy.cfm>

Nebraska State Elks Association offers several scholarships, including vocational, general, and a golf scholarship that are all open to Nebraska high school seniors, or high school seniors that reside within the jurisdictional boundaries of a Nebraska Lodge. There is also scholarship that is available to a high school senior who is a child or grandchild of a current Elks officer. All applications are due by February 15, 2025. Lincoln Lodge #80 scholarship applications are due by December 30, 2025. There are general scholarships that are available to any high school senior who attends a school within the jurisdictional area of the Lodge. MEALS FOR KIDS: WE CAN DO THIS

It is a sad fact that many children rely on school lunches for the majority of their daily food; some families struggle to afford to put adequate meals on the table. On weekends and during the summer when school is not in session, it's even more of a struggle and many children have no alternative but to go hungry.

Our Lodge partners with *We Can Do This*, a local non-profit. We Can Do This provides meals for children during weekends and in the summer, filling a vital need for kids and families. Elks Lodge #80 has donated food, hygiene items and occasional funding for this worthy cause.

On months when there is a fifth Sunday, Lodge volunteers meet at Lincoln's Belmont Community Center to put together grab and go bags with perishable and non-perishable foods for children to pick up and take home. The meal kits allow them to have adequate nutrition over weekends when they don't receive school lunch.

The volunteer activity typically lasts from about 11:00 a.m. until just after 1:00 p.m. On August 31st, we were able to assemble packages to provide nearly 70 meals for kids, and on busier weekends, we can expect to distribute double that amount!

Making sure children have enough to eat is part of our Lodge's commitment to helping young people, and is time well spent. **If you'd like to volunteer, our next Sunday is November 30th. Call or Text Mary Ryan at 402-499-6881.**
